

New homes still available

If you'd like to own a home, but can't afford a high monthly mortgage payment, you might want to check with the town of Pulaski.

There are still some "infill" houses available that were constructed in Southeast Pulaski as part of the Dora Highway

Neighborhood Revitalization Project. The houses were constructed in areas where vacant and dilapidated homes were torn down.

Town Manager John Hawley said six infill houses have been constructed in the project area and some are still available for purchase to qualifying applicants.

The 960-square-foot homes carry monthly mortgage payments that range between \$400 and \$450 per month and Hawley points out the payment includes taxes and insurance. He also noted that


they are "very energy efficient."

"There are some attractive homes over there. I encourage people to go look at them," said Mayor Jeff Worrall.

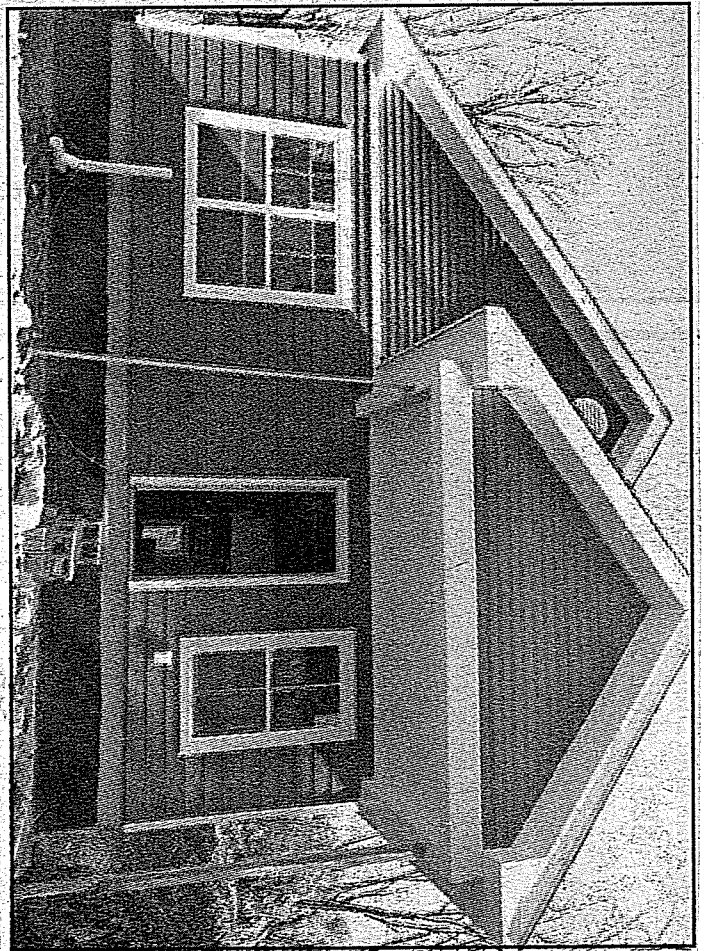
In order to qualify for one of the homes, an applicant's household income cannot exceed 80 percent of the median income for the town. For a family of four, that would be \$46,250 per year. They also must be first-time homebuyers.
